### **WE BELIEVE**





#### **PARKING**

There are reserved accessible parking spaces available on campus, in front of the studio building, as well as plentiful street parking surrounding the office building on 27 Sims Avenue.

### **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

Get off at the RIPTA bus stop on Atwells Avenue before Harris Avenue. Take Harris Ave one block and then turn on left onto Sims Avenue. ### **RESTROOMS**

There are two accessible all-gender single-occupancy restrooms available in the studio building. Both restrooms are equipped with grab bars. See page Page 7, item 4 for location.

### STUDIO/PROGRAM ACCESSIBILITY FEATURES

We are continually making efforts to position all equipment to allow wheelchair access through the studio. However, there are areas in the building that are not fully accessible for every kind of disability. For program participants who are hard of hearing there are wireless voice amplifiers available for instructors.

**CERAMIC WHEEL:** Adjustable height with moveable metal frame for knee clearance. Wheel can accommodate most chairs or it



can be used while standing, The foot pedal can be adjusted and operated by a lever.

JEWELRY WORK BENCH: Jewelry bench designed with enough knee clearance underneath that can accommodate most chairs allowing the user to be close and at eye level to the work area.

WELDING BAYS AND TABLES: Large welding bays available with adjustable curtained walls and welding tables of varying heights no less than 28" and no more than 34" above the floor. Each bay is equipped with hooks for flame retardant blankets. There are also custom plasma and torch cutting tables designed with enough knee clearance underneath that can accommodate most chairs.

**BLACKSMITHING:** Adjustable height anvils.

### **OUTDOOR CAMPUS EVENTS**

The Steel Yard hosts a variety of community building events throughout the year. All of our events are 100% wheelchair accessible. Event attendees have access to both a fully ADA accessible portable restroom as well as custom wheelchair-accessible picnic tables.

### **SERVICE ANIMALS**

Officially licensed service animals are welcome in all indoor/outdoor programs. Studio and events can be suddenly loud so the special training a service animal receives is integral to the safety of the animal and our visitors.

### TOURS & SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS

Your experience at The Steel Yard is important to us. Advance notice may be necessary to arrange for some accessibility needs. If you have a disability and require special accommodations for any of our programs please contact us to discuss your needs.


